Abstract formatting

- Abstract must be in English
- The file must be saved as .doc or .docx format
- Use your name as the filename
- Font: Times New Roman
- Title: Bold, font size 14
- Author(s) name(s): Regular, font size 11, presenting author underlined
- Author(s) affiliation(s): Italic, font size 10
- E-mail address of presenting author: Regular, font size 11
- Text body max 350 words: Regular, font size 11
- References: Regular, font size 10
- Line spacing: Single
- You are free to add any figure you wish
- The abstract must fit on A4 size

Authors will be notified about the delivery of their abstract, its acceptance, and the format for presentation (oral or digital poster) by e-mail. The abstracts and the list of participants will be included in an electronic abstract book (.pdf format), within the series UrbanFarm (ISSN:2612-7660) published by the University of Bologna.
